World Homoeopathy Day: 10 April:-

Every year on April 10, the world celebrates World Homeopathy Day in honor of German physician and chemist Dr. Samuel Hahnemann. Although homeopathy is thought to have originated in the fifth century BC, it wasn't until the nineteenth century that it became well-known in Europe and eventually made its way to North America. Practitioners of homeopathy employ trace amounts of organic materials, such as plants and minerals, to encourage the body's own healing mechanism. The day is celebrated in India under the aegis of the Ministry of AYUSH, govt of India, for the last few years. The theme for World Homeopathy Day 2024 is 'Empowering Research, Enhancing Proficiency: A Homeopathy Symposium".

India Secures Second Overseas Port: Sittwe Agreement Approved By MEA:-

India now has the authority to run Sittwe in Myanmar, a second overseas port in addition to Chabahar. An agreement to transfer management of the entire port situated on the Kaladan River to India Ports Global (IPGL) has been authorized by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). The Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways owns all shares in IPGL. China and India are fighting each other to gain more economic clout in the Indian Ocean. Ports have become highly significant in this rivalry.

Wipro Appoints New CEO: Srinivas Pallia:-



Mudra Loans Surge Past ₹5 Lakh Crore Mark In FY24 :-

According to the most recent government data, small business loans under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY) saw record increase in disbursals in FY24 and also passed the ₹5 lakh crore milestone. The amount of loans approved in the most recent fiscal year was ₹5.28 lakh crore. In the fiscal year that concluded in March 2024, the total disbursals were ₹5.20 lakh, compared to ₹4.40 lakh crore in the preceding fiscal year. Nearly 70 per cent of the beneficiaries of these loans are women. Mudra loans are extended in three categories — Shishu (up to ₹50,000), Kishor (above ₹50,000 and up to ₹5 lakh) and Tarun (above ₹5 lakh and up to ₹10 lakh).

Indian Army Enhances Air Defence With Igla-S MANPADS:-

As part of a wider arrangement that includes local production in India, the Indian Army has received the first batch of 24 Igla-S Man Portable Air Defence Systems (MANPADS) made in Russia together with 100 missiles. The Indian Army is acquiring the Igla-S system in order to improve its Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) capabilities. Compared to the lesser emergency purchase made in 2021, this procurement is significant, according to sources in the defense establishment. The Igla-S is a hand-held defence system that can be operated by an individual or crew.




111-Year-Old John Alfred Tinniswood Becomes World's Oldest Man:-

Guinness World Records (GWR) has announced the world's oldest living man, 111-year-old John Alfred Tinniswood, from England. Born in Merseyside, Northern England, in 1912, Tinniswood has experienced two world wars. Although Tinniswood's accomplishment is certainly noteworthy, it is important to remember that he is not the oldest person in history. Jiroemon Kimura, a Japanese man who lived to be 116 years and 54 days old, was the oldest man in history. Maria Branyas Morera of Spain, who is currently 117 years old and the oldest living woman, is the oldest living person overall.

Centre Appoints Manoj Panda As New Finance Commission Member :-

According to an announcement from the finance ministry, Manoj Panda, a former director of the Institute of Economic Growth, has been named by the government as a full-time member of the 16th Finance Commission. Panda conducts research on a variety of topics, including growth and distribution-focused fiscal policy, alternative trade, and macroeconomic trends and predictions. Previously, Panda served as Director of the Centre for Economic and Social



Studies (CESS), Hyderabad and as a Professor and Associate Professor at the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR), Mumbai.

Tata Advanced Systems Ltd (TASL) Launches India's First Privately-Built Sub-Metre Resolution Surveillance Satellite:-

The TSAT-1A, India's first sub-meter resolution earth observation satellite, has been successfully launched into orbit by Tata Group's Tata Advanced Systems Limited, marking a significant milestone. The is the first of its kind in India, invented by the private sector and constructed in collaboration with Satellogic. A SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket carrying the payload launched the rocket from Florida's Kennedy Space Center. TSAT-1A promises to revolutionize satellite imaging with its high-resolution capabilities and swift data delivery.
