#### World Day Against Child Labour: 12 June:-

June 12 marks World Day Against Child Labour. Its mission is to ignite the growing global movement against child labour. On June 12, 2002, the International Labour Organization (ILO) recognized the first World Day Against Child Labour at its Geneva headquarters, which had been established the day before. World Day Against Child Labour was created to promote and amplify the global call to end child labour. Since 1987, the Indian central government has implemented a National Policy on Child Employment, which focuses on the rehabilitation of children and adolescents who have been exposed to employment. This year the theme is "Let's act on our commitments: End Child Labour!".

# **Competition Commission of India**

#### InderPal Singh Bindra Appointed As CCI Secretary :-

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has a new Secretary, Inder Pal Singh Bindra, an Indian Revenue Service (IRS) officer. Bindra will succeed Anupama Anand, who resigned following a three-year term beginning in September 2023. Bindra worked as an income tax officer before becoming CCI Secretary. He has now been appointed as CCI Secretary on a delegation basis for three years. The Centre had in September last year appointed Anupama Anand, an IRS officer, as the Secretary of the CCI, the country's competition watchdog, for an initial period of three years that could later be extended to seven years.

## SBI sanctioned loans amounting to ₹2,030 crore under co-lending tie-up with NBFCs :-

In order to expand its reach to the unserved and underserved population, the State Bank of India has so far entered into co-lending agreements with 23 non-banking finance companies (NBFCs)/housing finance companies (HFCs). Additionally, India's largest bank has established an end-to-end digital platform for loan underwriting, sanction, disbursement, and collections for NBFC co-lending. Under this model, SBI has sanctioned loans to more than 2.79 lakh borrowers amounting to ₹2,030 crore, according to the Bank's latest annual report.

#### Army Launches Integrated Generator Monitoring, Control System 'Vidyut Rakshak':-

A tech-based innovation 'Vidyut Rakshak', an integrated generator monitoring, protection and control system developed by the Army Design Bureau (ADB) was launched by the Army's Vice Chief Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi. Vidyut Rakshak is a fully integrated generator monitoring, protection, and control system that uses the Internet of Things. The Internet of Things (IoT) is a network of interconnected devices that communicate and share data with other IoT devices and the



cloud. Major Rajprasad R S invented Vidyut Rakshak, which was recently shown during the 'Exercise Bharat Shakti' and observed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

French President Dissolves Parliament After EU Election Defeat :-



Following France's far-right victory in the European Parliamentary elections, President Emmanuel Macron dissolved the country's National Assembly and called for new elections. The centre-right President's Renaissance party and its allies suffered significant losses in the European Parliamentary elections, obtaining a provisional 15.2% of the vote for French seats compared to the far-right Rassemblement National's (RN) provisional 31.5%. Far-right parties together won 40% of the available seats. Elections will be held on June 30 with a run-off round on July 7.

#### Priyanka Jarkiholi The Youngest Tribal Woman To Win In Lok Sabha:-

Priyanka Jarkiholi, the daughter of Congress nominee and Minister Satish Jarkiholi, won the Chikkodi seat, upsetting incumbent MP and BJP politician Annasaheb Jolle. Priyanka Jarkiholi of Chikkodi became the youngest tribal woman to enter Parliament from an unreserved seat in Karnataka since independence. On the contrary, the BJP has won all seats in Mumbai, Karnataka, with the exception of Chikkodi. She also became the second leader from a reserved community to win from a general seat, after Kotturu Hariharappa Ranganath who was a Lok Sabha member from Chitradurga during 1984-89.

#### Mumbai Cricket Association president Amol Kale passes away :-

Amol Kale, president of the Mumbai Cricket Association, died of a cardiac arrest in New York after attending the India-Pakistan T20 World Cup match. Kale, 47, became MCA president after defeating former India and Mumbai cricketer Sandip Patil in the October 2022 elections. During his tenure, the MCA made key critical decisions, including agreeing to match the BCCI match price for all red-ball players in the forthcoming 2024-25 season. In a statement released on its social media pages, MCA wrote, "We are deeply saddened by the unexpected loss of our President, Shri. Amol Kale."



## **DAILY UPDATE 8: SCHEMES AND COMMITTEES**



#### Centre Releases ₹1.39 Lakh Crore To States :-

The Centre approved tax devolution of ₹1,39,750 crore to states for June. The Finance Ministry announced that, in addition to the regular delivery of the devolution amount for June 2024, one additional installment will be released. "This cumulatively amounts to ₹1,39,750 crore in the current month. This will enable State Governments to accelerate development and capital spending," it added. Currently, 41 per cent of taxes collected by the Centre is devolved in 14 installments among states during a fiscal year.

#### Rajasthan Govt To Invest Rs 100 Cr In Maharana Pratap Tourist Circuit :-

Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma stated that the state government is spending Rs 100 crore to develop the Maharana Pratap Tourist Circuit. Sharma made these remarks while inaugurating the Maharana Pratap Jayanti celebrations in Udaipur. The chief minister stated that Maharana Pratap inspires not only Rajasthan and India, but the entire world. His valour, bravery and patriotism cannot be bound by time and geographical boundaries, Sharma said and added that Maharana Pratap's life "inspires us to not step back even in adverse circumstances and to always follow the path of truth, religion and national interest".
