The prize in neuroscience has been awarded to Nancy Kanwisher of MIT, Winrich Freiwald of Rockefeller University, and Doris Tsao of the University of California at Berkeley.

Peter Pellegrini Sworn In As Slovakia's President Amid Political Tensions :-

Peter Pellegrini took office as President of Slovakia recently in a ceremony held amid increased security following the assassination attempt on his close partner, populist Prime Minister Robert Fico, a month earlier. Pellegrini, 48, defeated pro-Western career diplomat Ivan Korcok in the presidential runoff vote on April 6. His win strengthened Fico's hold on power by granting him and his allies control of key strategic positions. He succeeded Zuzana Caputova, the country's first female head of state and a staunch backer of neighbouring Ukraine in its fight against Russia's invasion. She didn't seek a second term in the largely ceremonial post.




Vice President Inaugurates 'Prerna Sthal' At Parliament House Complex :-

India Surpasses Hong Kong To Reclaim Fourth Spot In Global Equity Market :-

Domestic equity markets have once again surpassed Hong Kong to recover the fourth-largest global market position. Following a dramatic comeback from election result day lows, India's market value has risen 10% to \$5.2 trillion, or Rs 435 trillion (BSE-listed businesses). In comparison, Hong Kong's market capitalization is \$5.17 trillion, down 5.4% from this year's high of \$5.47 trillion. India surpassed Hong Kong's market value for the first time in January. Since their market value has crisscrossed with each other a few times.



DAILY UPDATE 10 : SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY



India Set To Be The 6th Country To Have Its Own Deep Sea Mission :-

Union Earth Sciences Minister Jitendra Singh announced that India will become the sixth country to launch its own deepsea mission. Singh, who chaired a meeting to discuss the ministry's 100-day action plan, expressed pleasure and happiness over the deep-sea mission's development and India's status as one of the few nations to accomplish this achievement. He urged institutes to focus on building a robust blue economy to empower individuals who rely on the ocean and its energy for a living. He lauded the National institute of Ocean Technology's (NIOT) efforts for the development of Matsyayaan 6000, which can dive 6,000 metres deep into the ocean.
