


DAILY UPDATE 1: IMPORTANT DAY



World Youth Skills Day: 15 July:-

In 2014, the United Nations General Assembly designated July 15 as World Youth Skills Day (WYSD) to highlight the strategic importance of preparing young people for employment, decent labor, and entrepreneurship. International Honour For Andhra Pradesh Community Managed Natural Farming:

The Andhra Pradesh Community Managed Natural Farming (APCNF) program, led by the Andhra Pradesh government, has been awarded the prestigious Gulbenkian Prize for Humanity in 2024. Dr. Angela Merkel, Chair of the Jury and former Federal Chancellor of Germany, delivered the announcement at a ceremony in Lisbon, Portugal. The ceremony was attended by luminaries such as Portugal's President and other government officials, as well as international



professionals. APCNF shares the €1 million prize with Dr. Rattan Lal, a renowned soil scientist from the USA, and SEKEM, an Egyptian network promoting biodynamic farming.




Mallika Sarabhai releases book on Guruvayurappan College :-




Former IAS officer's book 'A Bureaucrat Recalls' released :-

Ex-IAS officer Capt Narinder Singh has poured his heart out in his book 'A Bureaucrat Recalls', discussing everything from the heroism of the Sikh Regiment to the current problem of heroin addiction among Punjabi teenagers. NITI Aayog Releases SDG India Index 2023-24:-

NITI Aayog issued the SDG India Index 2023-24, stating that India is making progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals amid worldwide challenges. The Index was inaugurated by NITI Aayog Vice Chairperson Suman Bery, in the presence of NITI Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam and others. Mr Subrahmanyam stated that India's composite score climbed from 57 in 2018 to 66 in 2020-21, and then to 71 in 2023-24. SDG India Index measures and tracks national progress of all States and UTs on 113 indicators. It computes goal-wise scores on the 16 SDGs for each State and UT.



DAILY UPDATE 7: RANK AND REPORT



Retail inflation surges to 5.08 per cent in June :-

India's retail inflation surged to a four-month high of 5.08 percent in June, up from 4.75 percent the previous month, while food inflation soared to 9.4 percent due to the impact of the heatwave on vegetables. Retail inflation rates for cereals, meat and fish, eggs, dairy, oils and fats, fruits, vegetables, pulses, sugar, spices, and prepared snacks and sweets increased on monthly basis, according to government data. Field staff personally visited 1,114 metropolitan markets and 1,181 villages across all states and union territories to collect the data. Inflation had dipped to a 12-month low of 4.75 percent in the previous month, despite food inflation hovering around 8.7 percent.

Haryana Cabinet Approves IT Saksham Yuva Scheme To Provide 5,000 Jobs In First Phase :-

The Haryana government has launched the IT Saksham Yuva Scheme 2024 to promote youth empowerment and employment. In its first phase, the plan seeks to employ 5,000 young people. Former Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar introduced the 'Mission 60,000' initiative during his 2024-25 budget speech, and it aims to employ at least 60,000 young people from low-income families. Under this scheme, graduate and post-graduate applicants with IT backgrounds will undertake the Haryana IT Programme, a specially designed short-term course lasting a minimum of three months.



DAILY UPDATE 9 : STATE



East India's First Disabled Varsity At Ranchi: Jharkhand:-

Champai Soren, former chief minister and minister of higher and technical education of Jharkhand, revealed plans to create eastern India's first university for the physically challenged on the outskirts of Ranchi, the state capital. Champai, who inspected the higher and technical education systems in Ranchi, stated that the proposal would be given to the cabinet for formal approval. The minister further said the proposed university will have special arrangements for



education of divyangs (disabled) suiting their needs and would strictly adhere to norms of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016.

DAILY UPDATE 10: STATE



Uttar Pradesh Mango Festival:-



Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said in Lucknow that the state will sell 40 tonnes of mangos to Japan and Malaysia. And, for the first time in its 160-year history, Lucknow's famous Dussehri will be sold to the United States. He was launching the Uttar Pradesh Mango Festival 2024 at Awadh Shilp Gram. Mr. Adityanath presented a mango exhibition that featured 120 different varieties of exceptional mangoes. The three-day mango festival, from July 12–14, features a mango-eating competition and a training seminar that has drawn mango farmers from U.P., Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Chhattisgarh.
