Kargil Vijay Diwas: 26 July:-

Kargil Vijay Diwas is observed every year on July 26 to honour the bravery of Indian soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country during the Kargil War of 1999. This event marks the end of the Kargil War between India and Pakistan, which began in May 1999. Indian forces successfully recovered their key position in the Kargil sector of Jammu and Kashmir, which had been penetrated by Pakistani soldiers and terrorists. In the battle that was held in J&K, 527 Indian soldiers lost their lives. India was declared the winner when the Pakistani army was compelled to withdraw.




C-DOT signs agreement with IIT, Roorkee and Mandi for "Development of 'Cell-Free' 6G Access Points":-

The Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT), a leading Telecom R&D centre of the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), Government of India, has entered into an agreement with the Indian Institute of Technology Roorkee (IIT Roorkee) and Indian Institute of Technology Mandi (IIT Mandi) to develop 'cell-free' 6G access points, marking a significant step toward indigenous technology development. This scheme aims to enable affordable



broadband and mobile services, playing a significant role in bridging the digital divide across India, the Ministry of Communications said in statement.



Ajinkya Naik Elected As The Youngest MCA President :-



The incumbent secretary, Ajinkya Naik, defeated vice-president Sanjay Naik by a massive 107 votes to become president of the Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA). Ajinkya, 37, became the MCA's youngest president to date. Election officer J.S. Saharia reported that 335 votes were given, with Ajinkya receiving 221 and Sanjay, representing the Ashish Shelar Group, receiving only 114. The election for the secretary's post, vacated after Ajinkya took charge, will now be held in 45 days.




Rahaab Allana Honored With French Arts And Letters Insignia:-

Rahaab Allana, a curator and novelist, received the insignia of Officier dans l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres at the French Embassy in New Delhi. The French government's award recognizes "persons who have distinguished themselves by their creativity in the disciplines of art, culture and literature or for their involvement in the impact of arts in France and throughout the world." 




DRDO Successfully Flight-Tests Phase-II Ballistic Missile Defence System :-

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully flight-tested the Phase-II Ballistic Missile Defence (BMD) system, establishing the indigenous capability to defend against ballistic missiles of the 5,000 km range. Phase 1 of the BMD system, capable of intercepting ballistic missiles with a range of 2,000 kilometers, has already been deployed. The flight test successfully validated the entire network-centric warfare weapon system, which included long-range sensors, a low latency communication system, a Mission Control Centre, and advance interceptor missiles, according to DRDO.





China, Australia, And India Lead In Forest Area Gains: FAO Report:-

According to a new research by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO), India gained 2,66,000 hectares of forest area per year between 2010 and 2020, placing it third among the top ten countries with the most notable forest area gains during this time frame. According to the research, China led the globe in forest area gain (19,37,000 hectares),

IOC Elects Salt Lake City-Utah as Host of 2034 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games :-

Salt Lake City, Utah, is going to host the Winter Olympics and Paralympics in 2034. The decision was made by IOC Members at the 142nd IOC Session in Paris. Salt Lake City conducted the Winter Olympics for the first time, in 2002. Out of 89 legitimate votes, Salt Lake City-Utah 2034 garnered 83 'yes' votes from IOC Members. The Salt Lake City-Utah 2034 delegation was led by the Governor of Utah, Spencer Cox, the Mayor of Salt Lake City, Erin Mendenhall, the President of the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC), Gene Sykes, and the President of the Salt Lake City-Utah Committee for the Games, Fraser Bullock.

Bihar Assembly passes Bill to prevent paper leaks in competitive exams :-

The Bihar Assembly has enacted a bill aimed at ending the plague of question paper leaks and other wrongdoing in the state's government recruitment exams. The Bihar Public Examinations (PE) (Prevention of Unfair Means) Bill, 2024, was introduced by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Vijay Kumar Chaudhary and approved via voice vote despite the Opposition's walkout. The Bill proposes imprisonment for three to five years and a fine of ₹10 lakh. if a service provider whether a government entity or a private agency engages in malpractices, it will face a fine of ₹1 crore and four year termination of it services.
