




World Hepatitis Day : 28 July :-

HS Dhaliwal Appointed New DGP Of Andaman And Nicobar Islands :-

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has named Hargobinder Singh Dhaliwal, a senior IPS officer, as the new Director General of Police in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Prior to his new post, Dhaliwal, a 1997-batch IPS officer, was the special commissioner of police in New Delhi, in charge of traffic zone II. Throughout his career, Dhaliwal has made major contributions, including solving prominent cases such as the Dhaula Kuan gangrape, the murder of journalist Saumya Vishwanathan, and the murder of Jigisha Ghosh.

Mankind Pharma Acquires Bharat Serums And Vaccines For Rs 13,600 Crore :-

Mankind Pharma said that it has signed a definitive deal to buy a 100% share in Bharat Serums and Vaccines (BSV) from private equity firm Advent International for Rs 13,630 crore. BSV recorded revenues of Rs 1,723 crore in FY24, representing a 20% year-on-year increase with adjusted EBITDA margins of 28%. The business has grown at a 21 per cent revenue compound annual growth rate over the last three years. More than 2,500 BSV employees will be joining Mankind.

India Post Releases Commemorative Postage Stamp On 25 Years of Kargil Vijay Diwas :-



Moidams Of Assam Added To UNESCO World Heritage List :-



The Charaideo Moidams burial sites in Assam have been designated World Heritage Sites by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). These are the royal burial grounds of the Ahom dynasty, which reigned over much of Assam and the Northeast from 1228 to 1826 AD. Charaideo's tumuli, located around 30 kilometers from Sivasagar in eastern Assam, are still revered by many locals. Ahom kings and queens were buried inside these moidams. Unlike Hindus who cremate their dead, the predominant funerary method of the Ahoms, originating from the Tai people, was the burial.

OpenAI Launches SearchGPT, A New Era In AI-Powered Search:-

OpenAI has unveiled SearchGPT, an AI-powered search engine that provides real-time access to content from across the internet and is Google's new competitor. The Sam Altman-led business stated that SearchGPT will be accessible as a prototype in limited release, with OpenAI intending to eventually include it into ChatGPT. SearchGPT is powered by the GPT-4 family of models and will be available to just 10,000 test users at launch. OpenAI spokesperson Kayla Wood said that the company is working with third-party partners and using direct content feeds to build its search results.

PM Chaired 9th Governing Council Meeting Of NITI Aayog :-

According to an official statement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired the 9th Governing Council meeting of NITI Aayog on July 27, which aimed at making India a developed nation by 2047. The council, the apex body of NITI Aayog, consists of all state chief ministers, lieutenant governors of Union Territories, and numerous Union ministers. Modi serves as the chairman of the NITI Aayog. According to the statement, the meeting intends to promote participatory governance and collaboration among the Centre and state governments, thereby improving the quality of life for both rural and urban inhabitants by strengthening government intervention delivery systems.
