
DAILY UPDATE 2 : AWARDS


DAILY UPDATE 3: BOOKS

For Hydro Electric Projects Budgetary Support Scheme Approved By Cabinet :-

The Union Cabinet authorized the Ministry of Power's proposal to amend the budgetary support offered for hydroelectric projects, according to the press information department. The budgetary support will now include construction expenses for enabling infrastructure, which will enable faster development of hydroelectric projects and improve infrastructure in remote project locations. The total outlay of the scheme is set at Rs 12,461 crore and will be applicable to pumped storage energy projects as well. The scheme is set to be implemented from fiscal 2025 to fiscal 2032.

Govt To Launch PAIR Programme To Boost Research In Higher Education Institutions :-

The government is going to unveil the Partnerships for Accelerated Innovation and Research (PAIR) programme, which aims to improve research capabilities in higher education institutions (HEIs) by connecting top-tier research institutions with those with limited research capability, resulting in a collaborative mentorship environment. The decision was taken during the inaugural Governing Board meeting of the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), Prof Abhay Karandikar, Secretary of the Department of Science and Technology, said.



ISRO tracks giant asteroid that will come 'very close' to Earth in 2029 :-

ISRO is tracking a big asteroid that is anticipated to pass very near to Earth in 2029. Asteroid 99942 Apophis, called the 'God of Chaos,' is due to come extremely close to Earth on April 13, 2029, at a distance of only 20,000 miles (32,000 km) - closer than many geostationary satellites, which are parked in a geo orbit 36,000 kilometers over the Earth's surface. Apophis is the Greek name of Apep, an enemy of the Ancient Egyptian Sun God Ra. At 32,000 km above Earth, no other asteroid of this size has ever come so close to our planet.

Cabinet Approves ₹2,000-Crore 'Mission Mausam' :-

Mission Mausam is a large-scale program launched by the Indian government to strengthen the country's weather forecasting and climate scientific capabilities. The program, with a budget of ₹2,000 crore for the first two years, intends to improve the India Meteorological Department's (IMD) ability to predict weather more accurately at numerous geographical and temporal scales. The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved this mission, marking it as a significant step forward in India's efforts to tackle extreme weather events and climate change.

India Hosted 2nd Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference On Civil Aviation :-

The 2nd Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Civil Aviation (APMC) was inaugurated by Union Minister for Civil Aviation, Shri Kinjarapu Rammohan Naidu at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. Held from 11th to 12th September 2024, the event is co-hosted by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the Ministry of Civil Aviation, Government of India. The first Ministerial Conference of the Asia Pacific region was organized in 2018 in Beijing, China. During the first conference, India volunteered to host the second Conference in 2020 however due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the conference was postponed.
