


World Ozone Day : 16 September :-

World Ozone Day, observed annually on September 16, is a unique day dedicated to raise awareness about the ozone layer's depletion and the effect on environmental health. In the 1980s, scientists discovered that human-made substances such as chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) and halons were depleting the ozone layer. This revelation sparked concerns about the potential consequences of ozone depletion, resulting in international action. In response to this depletion, the Montreal Protocol was adopted on September 16, 1987, to prevent the production of ozone-depleting substances. The theme for World Ozone Day 2024 is "Montreal Protocol: Advancing Climate Actions."

Malaysia Day : 16 September :-

Malaysia Day is observed on September 16th annually to commemorate the establishment of the Malaysian Federation on that date in 1963. The Federation of Malaya, the State of Singapore, Sabah, and Sarawak merged to form the federation. Malaysia Day is a public holiday in Malaysia that celebrates the country's unity and diversity. The day is typically marked with parades, cultural performances, and other festivities. In 2024, Malaysia Day will be the 61st anniversary of the formation of the Malaysian Federation.



UPI Users Can Now Send 5 Lakh For Some Transactions :-

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has enhanced transaction limits for tax payments via Unified Payments Interface (UPI), allowing people to transmit Rs 5 lakh in a single transaction beginning September 15. On August 8, 2024, the RBI announced an increase in the limit for tax payments through UPI from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 5 lakh per transaction. Consumers can now make UPI payments of up to Rs 5 lakh per transaction for the following categories: a) tax payments, b) hospital and educational services, and c) IPOs and government securities.



Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Unveiled A Book Titled 'History of Nath Panth' :-

The book "History of Nath Panth," written by Padmaja Singh, an assistant professor of ancient history at Deen Dayal Upadhyay (DDU) Gorakhpur University, was unveiled by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. In association with Hindustani Academy, Prayagraj, a two-day international conference on "The Contribution of Nath Panth in Building a Harmonious Society" was held in conjunction with the book launch. Padmaja Singh's extensive research compiles historical sources from across India, offering a fact-based interpretation of traditional narratives.



To Resolve Exporters Issue Piyush Goyal Unveils Portal :-

Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce and Industry, has launched two digital initiatives to help exporters, increase transparency, and make exports easier to do. The Jansunwai Portal provides exporters with relevant information, clarifications, and concerns, as well as the status of complaints and a video-conferencing option to speak directly to officials from the several departments responsible for exports. Goyal launched the second portal called the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) portal of the Export Credit Guarantee Corporation of India (ECGC).



India Participates In BRICS Literature Forum 2024 In Russia :-

The BRICS Literature Forum 2024 began on September 11 in Kazan, Russia, and brought together notable writers, poets, philosophers, artists, and scholars from the BRICS countries. The mayor of Kazan, Ilсур Metshin, opened the forum with the topic "World Literature in the New Reality: Dialogue of Traditions, National Values, and Cultures." The Sahitya Akademi's President, Madhav Kaushik, and Secretary, Dr. K. Sreenivasarao, represented India in the event. During the plenary session, Madhav Kaushik emphasized the importance of literature in fostering unity and cooperation across societies in the modern world.



Union Minister Jyotiraditya M. Scindia Launches 'Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav' Website :-

Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Hon'ble Union Minister for Communications and Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), unveiled the official website for the much-anticipated Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav, taking a crucial step toward honoring Northeast India's rich cultural and economic history. The festival, to be held from December 6th to 8th, 2024, in New Delhi, draws inspiration from the eight Northeastern states—Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, and Tripura—collectively known as the "Ashtalakshmi," representing eight forms of prosperity.




Cristiano Ronaldo Creates History, Becomes First To Breach One Billion Barrier On Social Media :-

Cristiano Ronaldo has set numerous records both on and off the field throughout his career. The Portugal star has once again made history by becoming the first person to reach one billion followers across all social media platforms. Ronaldo is the most followed person on Instagram and has lately launched his YouTube channel, 'UR. Cristiano.' The channel gained 50 million subscribers in just one week, and it only took him 90 minutes to get one million subscribers. The social media record comes just after Ronaldo created another record, becoming the first-ever football player to score 900 career goals.



India Jumps To Tier 1 In Global CyberSecurity Index 2024 :-

India has risen to Tier 1 in the International Telecommunication Union's (ITU) Global Cybersecurity Index (GCI) 2024, in terms of role-modeling as part of the country's cybersecurity pledges and ensuing impacts. The 'GCI 2024' uses a new five-tier analysis, which allows for a greater emphasis on each country's progress toward cybersecurity commitments. The report placed 46 countries in Tier 1, the highest of the five tiers, reserved for "role modelling" countries that demonstrate a strong commitment in all five cybersecurity pillars.



Himachal First State To Legalise Seizing Property Of Those Selling Spurious Liquor, Says CM Sukhu :-

Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu announced that Himachal Pradesh has become the first state to enact a provision for seizing the property of persons involved in the illicit and counterfeit liquor trade. He stated that the state administration is taking harsh steps against people involved in the illegal and fake liquor sector. "Recently, amendments were made to the Himachal Pradesh Excise Act, 2011, tightening the noose against individuals involved in unlawful activities," he said. These new provisions would go a long way in controlling the illegal liquor trade, he added.
