



Navika Sagar Parikrama II:-

Two female officers from the Indian Navy will go on a global maritime adventure, the Navy stated. The Navy has stated that Lieutenant Commanders Roopa A and Dilna K would shortly embark on the "extraordinary expedition" as part of the second Navika Sagar Parikrama onboard INSV Tarini. Both officers have been preparing for the assignment for the last three years. The officers were part of a six-member crew that participated in a trans-oceanic expedition from Goa to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, via Cape Town, South Africa, and back.

Iran Launches Second Satellite This Year :-

Iran launched a research satellite into orbit using a Revolutionary Guards-built rocket, according to official television. The launch comes as the US and European countries accuse Iran of delivering ballistic missiles to Russia, which will most certainly be utilized in its battle with Ukraine in the coming weeks. Iran has disputed it. The Chamran-1 satellite, launched into space by the Qaem-100 satellite carrier, has been placed in a 550-kilometer (340-mile) orbit and its first signals have been received, according to the media. The Revolutionary Guards' Aerospace Force designed and built the solid fuel carrier.

Oscar Piastri Claims Maiden Victory At Azerbaijan Grand Prix:-

Oscar Piastri of McLaren won his first Formula One race at the Azerbaijan Grand Prix, marking an important milestone in his career. The 23-year-old McLaren driver won his second race of the season in Baku, passing Charles Leclerc and holding off the Ferrari driver until an incident on the penultimate lap resulted in a virtual safety car finish. Piastri's first win at the Hungarian Grand Prix in July was overshadowed by a team orders argument in which Lando Norris grudgingly relinquished the lead to allow his Melbourne-born teammate to cross first.

Neeraj Chopra Finished 2nd By 0.01m In Diamond League Final:-

Neeraj Chopra of India finished second in the Diamond League Final, trailing only Paris Olympics bronze medalist Anderson Peters in the men's javelin category. Neeraj's best attempt at the King Baudouin Stadium in Brussels was 87.86 meters, trailing only Peters by one centimetre. Peters earned the prestigious Diamond Trophy, announcing his return to form for the 2024 season. Julian Weber of Germany finished third, with a best effort of 85.97 meters. Olympic champion Arshad Nadeem and last year's Diamond Trophy winner Jakub Vadlejch did not compete in the Brussels Diamond League Final.
